## Dear Partners of Kairos,

The 2022-2023 year was our first operational year free of disruptions from governmental lockdown restrictions. It was incredible to watch our staff and students thrive while also having the chance to integrate new mental health trainings and the freedom to modify our courses to ensure our youth were maximally benefitting from the program.

The year was not free of hardship, but despite the challenges of consistent budget amendments and complex mentorship cases, we were still able to meet our promise of wholistically investing in our youth. This year, we were able to host our first overnight retreat for the women in our program, provide extended counseling services for our youth, conduct over 571 individualized mentorship sessions, provide food relief for our 18 youth, hold over 363 hours of business courses, and remain a consistent presence in the community.

Our 18 graduates from the class of 2023 are working hard in their new employment, working on building their supplemental income, or continuing their education. After conducting alum surveys from all 48 of our Kairos graduates

to date, nearly 80% of them are engaged in employment or continued education. This is a huge praise and testament to all God is doing through Kairos!

More notably, we saw growth in emotional intelligence and responsibility, resilience, and hope through the investment in the hearts of our youth. Additionally, all of our '23 graduates claimed that the mentorship program tremendously impacted their confidence, reflected in their successes. We have had many celebrations over the past year.





According to research by the America Phycological Association, out of the 9.8% of GDP that is spent on healthcare in Uganda, only 1% of that is allocated to mental health.

#### SOUL (MENTORSHIP)

The soul component is the heart of our program. Youth are required to attend both group and individual mentorship sessions. Each young adult is matched with a mentor that guides them through the program, meeting with them each week to be a sounding board, an advisor, and invest in their mental health.



#### MIND (BUSINESS EDUCATION)

The mind component of our program is evident in our business education courses. Each course is taught with all educational backgrounds in mind and with heavy use of practical examples, allowing students to put what they have learned in the classroom into immediate practice in their lives.





#### **SKILLS (VOCATIONAL TRAINING)**

Each youth is guided in the vocation of their choice and given training in their chosen trade. Pairing the practical with the business mind allows youth to be more successful in their next endeavors. Kairos works with local businesses and strong vocational centers to have an array of high quality training possibilities.




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Variety matters. By training youth in something they are passionate about, it creates more variety in the market and longevity in the workforce.

Of our graduates 48 graduates to date, 75.7% are engaged via continued education, dignified work, or self-employment after the program.


# Who We Serve

The young adults that we serve are between the ages of 18-25, and encompass multiple forms of vulnerability. We work alongside local leadership to identify youth in our community that would benefit from our programming the most. Our youth are faced with immense challenges - orphanhood, food insecurity, unemployment, lack of funds for education, impoverished, and/or overwhelming family responsibilities. Additionally, we have seen how each of these factors have had overall negative impacts on mental health.





Our program is of no cost to the community or youth we serve, their only financial responsibility is travel to and from the program. This means our youth often show great commitment by walking many miles each day.



In our 22-23 programming year, our youth spanned a distance of 19.9 km (12.3 miles). We are proud of how our youth have become change makers in their communities, causing a ripple effect much larger than we could measure!

# MENTORSHIP "SOUL"

Our mentorship program is not just about helping someone through a difficult situation; it's about walking through life alongside the mentee, acting as a pillar of strength and stability. When a youth comes to Kairos, our team takes the time to know each of them individually, getting to understand their specific needs. Conversations during individual sessions are aimed toward improving an individual's overall mental health, emotional maturity, and growing their confidence. Kairos mentees hold various religious beliefs; however, if they are interested, our mentors can also share scripture, offer prayer, and give spiritual guidance where they are able.







### **NAGUDI FAITH**

While growing up I was constantly criticized by my own parents and peers. They considered me as someone weak and unable to achieve certain things in life. I chose to pursue my dream of becoming a mechanic because I wanted to prove that this profession was not only for boys. I was also encouraged from a Kairos alum, Vicky, who had pursed the same trade. Her success gave me added hope that it can be possible for me to achieve my dream of becoming a female mechanic. Having now achieved some skills in this trade, my goal is to further my studies. I intend to pursue a diploma in motor vehicle engineering in one of the public institutions after which I will search for employment as a professional mechanic.



# BUSINESS EDUCATION "MIND"

Our business education is tailored specifically to meet the needs of the demographic of youth that we serve. Courses are taught by Ugandan professionals in their respective fields of expertise. Through the business education classes, youth learn how to manage their finances, market themselves, grow their business, become self-starters, and become hard workers with noble character. **These courses unlock endless potential and allow underserved youth to develop themselves intellectually and practically.** 





In the 22-23 programming year, Kairos provided **more than 363 hours of business education courses** taught by Ugandan professionals.




Average credit score of our 2023 graduates!


Every youth in our program is required to attend every course, each spanning from 3 to 8 weeks in length.



### Keeping youth accountable:

We hold our youth accountable through our scoring system that we call the "credit score." This score is compiled of data collected from each component (soul, mind, and skills) of our program. Students are required to maintain a minimum score of 70 to remain eligible for the benefits of the program. Not only does this credit score serve as a metric for success within the program, student's exiting scores allow us confidence to recommend individuals with high work ethic and character.









### **MASINDE CYRUS**

I graduated in March 2023 with a certificate in holistic development from Kairos International along with a skills certificate in auto mechanics. I currently have a part-time job at the nearby supermarket and on the other days of the week, I dedicate my time to practicing my trade.

Through the program, I learned a lot through mentorship. My mentor guided me in managing my time better and making good decisions. I also learned how to set clear goals and priorities which was essential for my development. For example, my mentor advised me to see the value in talking to my friends about my side business creating bangles (bracelets). By taking his advice, I saw growth in my business, and I now have an increased level of motivation.

I also learned so many business skills from the Sales and Marketing course. I learned how to interact and talk to my customers which has helped me market my products. Particularly, I have utilized persuasive advertisements to sell the bangles that I make for my customers.

Through the program, I chose to pursue a skill in motor mechanics because I am someone who loves vehicles a lot. When I was growing up, a car owner once told me that things would be easier if all car owners had the skills to maintain their own cars. This gave me the idea of pursuing motor vehicle mechanics and the motivation to tap into my potential as a mechanic. I plan to utilize the skills I have gained to render car repair services to my clients and expand my network by working collaboratively with other mechanics in this field.



# VOCATIONAL TRAINING "SKILLS"

It's no secret that hands-on experience is one of the best ways to learn a trade. In the same way, we believe our youth's unique passions and interests should be a driving force in what guides a sustainable career path. Enjoying the work that you do creates longevity. At Kairos, the youth are in the program for a minimum of 6 months before they decide which vocation they would like to pursue. During those crucial six months, our mentors, lecturers, and other stakeholders act as guides to allow the vocation decision to be made with all considerations.

# COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

As an organization, we pride ourselves on working collaborativly with the community. We know we are better and stronger together.

As a program requirement, Kairos youth are responsible for engaging their communities. They work together to establish an outreach project, work with local leaders to collaborate, submit their budget and project plan, and then follow through with implementing their service activity.





Each year, Kairos hosts a luncheon for local government and community leaders within our district. This time allows us the ability to discuss the community needs, receive feedback and suggestions, as well as share about our demographic for leaders to aid in the referral process.

We work with our partners in government, business, and religious institutions to share resources. This aids Kairos and the community at large to reach the young adults that truly need the services that Kairos provides. Simultaneously, it allows Kairos resources to refer youth for additional needs and connections.

As a chairman in this community, I feel Kairos is a blessing and we pray that God allows us to work together for years to come!




